For the past week herds of wildebeest and zebra have maintained their traditional migratory routes into the Mara.. There were many wildebeest and zebra crossing at Paradise Point, where there has been much action, with crossings in both directions.

With more animals in the Mara Triangle, there is now more than one crossing point at the river - which increases the chances of our guests seeing a crossing.
